

Enjoy the renowned collections of the **Owensboro Museum of Fine Art** and captivating productions by local and touring theater companies. The area's contribution to musical heritage is celebrated at the newly opened **Bluegrass Music Hall of Fame & Museum** with live music, exhibits, and special events. Owensboro is known as **Kentucky's Festival City** for its 20-plus annual celebrations, each with its unique charm and exceptional hospitality.

Recreation

Owensboro's diverse park system boasts **25 parks totaling 953 acres**, offering opportunities for golfing, hiking, mountain bike trails, tennis, softball, soccer, baseball, hockey, swimming, figure skating, basketball, and more.

The 15-mile long Greenbelt Park encircles the city with a 10-foot-wide paved path for walking, biking, running, or rolling.

Holiday World & Splashin' Safari – 37 miles A combination theme park and water park in Southern Indiana, with thrilling rides and slides for all ages.

Mammoth Cave National Park – 85 miles

Home to thousands of years of human history and a rich diversity of plant and animal life, earning it the title of UNESCO World Heritage Site and International Biosphere Reserve.

Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area – 107 miles

A 170,000-acre playground between Kentucky Lake and Lake Barkley in Western Kentucky.
