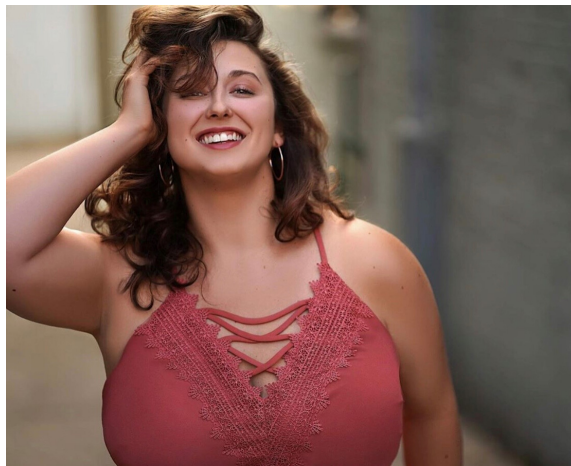


Wesleyan Wednesday
