- Planning and monitoring of capital expenditures and fixed assets.
- Monitoring and reviewing the financial and risk management policies to ensure that effectiveness, accuracy, and efficiency are a priority.

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in accounting.
- Five years of previous experience in a bookkeeping, accounting, or financial position in private industry. Previous experience in higher education is preferred.
- Working knowledge and experience in business operations, budget management, and business policies.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills with special aptitude for compiling, interpreting, and communicating financial data in a succinct yet thorough manner.
- Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to discuss and explain financial matters to individuals with a non-financial background.
- Ability to handle sensitive information with discretion and confidentiality.
