The teaching load is four courses (12 hours) per semester. Additional responsibilities include advising students, professional service, and engaging in the life of the college. This full-time position will begin in August 2019.

- A strong commitment to teaching, mentoring, and working with undergraduate students and a passion for providing an exceptional class room experience for our students.
- Evidence of scholarly activity.

- Some collegiate teaching experience.
- A desire to be of service to the college and to the external community.
